



The UK recognises the important contribution international students make, and welcomes those who wish to study at our world-class institutions. This leaflet is designed to provide you with some information about the Tier 4 visa routes for those wishing to study in the UK.

Student Visas (Tier 4)

There are two categories under Tier 4:



General student for students aged 16 years and above



Child student for children aged 4 to 17 years Please refer to our website for more information www.gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa

From April 2015, non EEA students who apply to come to the UK, study for longer than 6 months will be required to pay a health surcharge. This costs £150 for students and entitles you to access the National Health Service (NHS) in the same way as a permanent UK resident.

Student Visitor visas

Separate to Tier 4 visas, we also offer short-term study visas for courses that last six months or less (or 11 months if you are studying English language) and are aged 18 or over.

What do I need to apply for a Tier 4 student visa from overseas?

You will need:

- A Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) - This is completed online by your chosen place of study (sponsor) and contains details about you, your course, qualifications and confirmation of your English language skills. Your sponsor will give you a unique CAS reference number which you will need to make your application.
- Finance You must provide evidence (for example: an original bank statement) showing us that you have enough money to pay for your course fees for the first year and your living costs for up to 9 months.
- English language requirement If you are a Tier 4 (General) student you will need to show that you speak English.
 The level of English language proficiency you need will depend on the course you are applying to study. You may also need to provide evidence of your English language ability with your application.
- Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS) certificate - You will need an ATAS certificate if you intend to undertake studies in designated science and technical subjects.
- Tuberculosis (TB) certificate Please check our TB page at
 www.gov.uk/tb-test-visa to see if
 you need a TB certificate.

- Suitable travel, reception and care arrangements for children - If you are a Tier 4 (Child) student you must show that there are suitable arrangements in place for your travel, reception and care in the UK.

Where documents are requested, you should provide originals unless we specifically state otherwise. Where these documents are not in English you may need to provide a translation.

How do I apply for my visa?

- Go to www.visa4UK.fco.gov.uk to complete your visa application form, book an appointment and pay your visa fee online.
- Prepare your application package including a printed and signed copy of your application form, your supporting documents, your passport and a passport style photo.
- Visit the visa application centre to submit your application and biometric data at the time of your appointment. You may also be required to sit a short interview.

How long will it take to get my visa?

We aim to process student visas within 15 working days. We recommend that you prepare and apply for your visa well in

advance. You can make an application up to 3 months before you intend to travel.

Some countries offer a **3-5 day priority visa service** for an additional fee. Check your visa application centre website for information on available priority services **www.gov.uk/find-a-visa-application-centre**

How long can I stay in the UK?

Your Tier 4 visa will be granted for the whole length of your course. The maximum amount of time you can spend studying at degree level and above is 5 years with exceptions for some courses and PhD students. The time allowed does not include the time spent studying as a child student.

Can I work in the UK?

This will depend on the level of the course you are applying to study and the type of sponsor you have. Further information is on our website www.gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa

Can I stay and work in the UK after completing my course?

There are a number of options available if you wish to stay in the UK to work after your studies:

- The Doctorate Extension Scheme for students successfully completing a PhD or other doctoral qualification at a higher education institution
- Tier 2 (General) for those with a graduate-level job offer
- Tier 1 (Graduate Entrepreneur) for those who want to develop a business idea
- Tier 5 for those undertaking professional training
- Tier 5 (Internship)

Can I bring my partner and children with me?

Only the following students will be able to bring their partners and children to the UK:

- Postgraduate students at higher education institutions on courses of 12 months or more
- Government sponsored students on courses lasting longer than 6 months

Can my parent accompany me while I study in the UK?

There is a visa route which allows a parent to accompany a child 12 years or younger and is attending an independent fee paying day school.

Can I extend my visa in the UK?

Yes you can. You will need to provide documents as specified in the guidance and ensure that you make the application before your current leave runs out. You must have an unconditional offer of a place on a course with a qualified education provider. You will also need to show that you have enough money to support yourself and pay for your course.
